The GOP Leadership has announced the following schedule for Wednesday, May 7: The House will meet at 12:00 p.m. for legislative business. The House is expected to consider H.Res. ___ – the Republican Contempt Resolution (Rep. Issa – Oversight and Government Reform). The House is also expected to begin consideration of [H.R. 4438](#) – American Research and Competitiveness Act of 2014 (Rep. Brady (TX) – Ways and Means) (Subject to a Rule) and [H.Res. 565](#) – Calling on Attorney General Eric H. Holder, Jr., to appoint a special counsel to investigate the targeting of conservative non-profit groups by the Internal Revenue Service (Rep. Jordan – Judiciary) (Subject to a Rule). Additionally, the House is expected to consider bills under suspension of the Rules.

"Former Pennsylvania Sen. Rick Santorum on Monday morning said he agrees with former [R] Minnesota Gov. Tim Pawlenty that Republicans should support an increase in the minimum wage. Speaking with Chuck Todd on MSNBC, the 2012 Republican presidential candidate said the GOP stance on minimum wage 'makes no sense.' 'Let's not make this argument that we're for the blue-collar guy but we're against any minimum wage increase ever,' Santorum said of Republicans. 'It just makes no sense.' Last week, on the same day that Democrats brought legislation to raise the minimum wage to the Senate floor, Pawlenty, a Republican, said he thought his party should support a minimum wage increase... Santorum also said that Republicans who disagree with the minimum wage are out of step with the American public. 'If the Republicans want to go out and say, 'we're against the minimum wage,' then go out and make the argument to the American public and the 80-some percent of the American public who believes we should have a minimum wage,' he said."
