Suspensions (2 bills):

- H.Res. 133** – Providing amounts from the applicable accounts of the House of Representatives for continuing expenses of standing and select committees of the House from April 1, 2005, through April 30, 2005 (*Rep. Ney – House Administration*)
- H.Res. 122** – Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives regarding the study of languages and supporting the designation of a Year of Languages (*Rep. Holt – Education & the Workforce*)

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 9, AND THURSDAY, MARCH 10, 2005

On Wednesday and Thursday, the House will meet at 10:00 a.m. for legislative business

Suspensions (4 bills):

- H.Res. 41** – Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that a day should be established as "National Tartan Day" to recognize the outstanding achievements and contributions made by Scottish-Americans to the United States (*Rep. McIntyre – Government Reform*)
- H.R. 438** – To designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 2000 Allston Way in Berkeley, California, as the "Maudelle Shirek Post Office Building" (*Rep. Lee – Government Reform*)
- H.Res. 16** – Supporting the goals of National Manufacturing Week, congratulating manufacturers and their employees for their contributions growth and innovation, and recognizing the challenges facing the manufacturing sector (*Rep. Gillmor – Energy & Commerce*)
