"U.S. economic conditions kept improving slightly at the start of 2010, but the blizzards that hit the East Coast in February hurt several areas....In its latest beige book report, the Fed said nine out of its 12 regional districts reported that economic activity improved, but in most cases the increases were modest, with activity held back by the Feb. 4-7 and Feb. 9-11 snowstorms.... February's severe winter weather is expected to have hurt several sectors of the economy. Analysts believe data Friday will show the U.S. economy continued to shed jobs as unusually violent snow storms walloped the East Coast last month."
