The National Association of Manufacturers (NAM), the nation's largest industrial trade association representing small and large manufacturers in every industrial sector and in all 50 states, urges you to support H.R. 5325, the America COMPETES Reauthorization Act of 2010.

The NAM strongly supports reauthorization of the COMPETES Act, as its programs are working to strengthen innovation in the U.S. manufacturing sector and to build a stronger workforce. Key programs in H.R. 5325 of significant interest to manufacturers include: federal funding for basic R&D; the Advanced Research Projects Administration for Energy (ARPA-E); the Hollings Manufacturing Extension Partnership (MEP), which helps thousands of small and medium manufacturers increase their productivity and technological capabilities; and science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) education grants that will help increase the number and quality of students receiving degrees in areas of importance to manufacturers.
