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Dear Fellow Democratic Member:

As you know, the President's proposed budget severely under-funds numerous programs that are vital for protecting our homeland. From cuts to first responder programs to failures to meet the security needs for airlines, ports, and surface transportation, the President's budget does not prioritize efforts to reduce the risk of a terrorist attack here at home or to properly respond to an attack that does occur.

As Democrats, we must highlight the security gaps in the President's budget, and we must do it in our home districts, not just in the national media. The Department of Homeland Security's programs are mostly performed in the form of national initiatives (*e.g.* the TSA's baggage screening program), but this packet provides you with information about a number of programs that have specific expenditures in your district. It also has some information on programs that have a very identifiable local impact, but for which local expenditures are not available (*e.g.* the number of Border Patrol agents).

I urge you to use this information, and the enclosed sample press releases, to issue your own press releases, submit editorials, hold press conferences or town hall meetings, write direct mail, conduct surveys, etc. Take action on a local level!

THE OVERALL BUDGET FOR DHS CREATES MANY SECURITY GAPS

The Bush budget provides only a modest increase of 7 percent for Homeland Security Department's programs – which is only a 1.2 percent increase when fee-funded items are removed. The President requests \$34.2 billion in discretionary funding for Department of Homeland Security (DHS) programs in FY 2006 – which represents an increase of \$2.2 billion or 7 % over this year's level. However, if you subtract out all of the fee-related items in the budget (i.e. the new airline ticket fees), the total net discretionary funding requested is \$29.3 billion, an increase of only 1.2 % (less than the expected rate of inflation.)

First Responder Cuts

The President's budget cuts the Office of State and Local Government Programs, the main agency responsible for aiding first responders, by \$420 million – a 10.5% cut compared with current funding. This includes cuts to the following programs (more details on these cuts, and the impact on your state, appear later in this document):

1. The State Homeland Security Grant Program, which provides grants to first responders in all fifty states and U.S. territories to help them prevent, prepare for, and respond to an act of terrorism.
2. The FIRE Act, the program that provides equipment, training and staffing to local fire departments.
3. The Local Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program, which assists local law enforcement agencies in information sharing, target hardening, threat recognition and mapping, counter-terrorism and security planning, interoperable communications, and terrorist interdiction.
4. The Metropolitan Medical Response System, a program that helps 124 metropolitan medical systems enhance and sustain their preparedness to respond to mass casualties from a disaster.
5. The Emergency Management Performance Grants Program, which helps state and local emergency managers develop, maintain and improve their emergency management capabilities for all disasters, including terrorist attacks.

The budget contains NO dedicated funding to ensure our first responders have the equipment they need to talk to one another in a crisis.

The Budget also cuts several programs run by the Department of Justice that put more police on the streets and ensure they have the tools needed to fight any type of crime—including terrorism. For example, the budget nearly eliminates the COPS program, part of President Clinton's initiative to put 100,000 new police on America's streets.

Cuts to State Homeland Security Grants

The President's budget cuts the State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) by \$80 million—from \$1.1 billion to \$1.02 billion (7%). SHSGP provides grants to first responders in all fifty states and U.S. territories to help them prevent, prepare for, and respond to an act of terrorism, including by providing for planning, equipment acquisition, training, and exercise needs. **These cuts will severely affect the ability of first responders to prepare for and do their jobs.**

The President's budget also mandates that at least 20% of SHSGP funds go for law enforcement terrorism prevention activities – activities that were funded by the Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Grants that are zeroed out for next year. While our police need further help, this means that 20% – or \$204 million – of SHSGP funds cannot be used to support other, non-law enforcement first responder needs.

In order to free-up funds to permit more homeland security grants to be allocated based on risk, the President's budget seeks to change the formula for distribution of the SHSGP so that no state gets less than 0.25% of the total (current law is 0.75%).

The budget contains NO dedicated funding to ensure our first responders have the equipment they need to talk to one another in a crisis.

1. Attached as Appendix # 2 is a copy of the amount of SHSGP funding your state received in FY 2005 and FY 2004. As a result of the cut in SHSGP in the President's budget, it is likely your state will receive less from this program in FY 2006.
2. Attached is a sample press release for you to issue on the cuts to the SHSGP.
3. Hold a local press conference with any of the local unions representing first responders affected by the President's proposed cut (*e.g.* firefighters and police unions). A list of just a few of these unions is enclosed as Appendix # 1.
4. Conduct and publish a survey of some of the first responder unions in your district on whether they have adequate interoperability equipment or feel adequately trained and prepared for a terrorist attack.

(State Name) Will Receive Less General Homeland Security Funds Under the President's Budget, Representative (Name) Announces

Washington, D.C. -- Representative (Name) issued the following statement on President Bush's proposed budget cuts to the State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP).

SHSGP provides grants to first responders in all fifty states and U.S. territories to help them prevent, prepare for, and respond to an act of terrorism, including by providing for planning, equipment acquisition, training, and exercise needs. The President's budget cuts SHSGP by \$80 million—from \$1.1 billion to \$1.02 billion (7%). Additionally, the budget contains no dedicated funding to ensure our first responders have the equipment they need to talk to one another in a crisis.

Representative (name) stated: "President Bush's budget cuts to the State Homeland Security Grant Program undermine state efforts to close security gaps and ultimately leaves Americans vulnerable."

The President has misplaced priorities in his budget. As Joseph Estey, President of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (and Chief of the Hartford, VT Police Department), recently stated, "This administration talks about homeland security but then guts funding for the very programs that help secure our homeland."

Sam A. Cabral, President of the International Union of Police Associations, stated the following regarding the effect of the President's budget on first responders' ability to communicate with one another: "The lack of funding for interoperability among first response agencies endangers both law enforcement personnel and the public they are sworn to protect. Without the needed equipment, effective communications among diverse agencies such as Law Enforcement, Fire & Rescue, and Emergency Medical Services is dangerously compromised. Interoperability of emergency communications systems often stands between them and disaster during a critical incident. When their efforts are hampered, the public safety is compromised."

Representative (name) added: **"These cuts will have the most troubling impact on our nation's police, firefighters, and paramedics, who will have less of the training, equipment and support they need when serving as America's first line of defense. The President does not even provide funds to ensure these heroes have the communications tools needed talk to one another when emergencies arise."**

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FIREFIGHTER ASSISTANCE CUTS

The President's budget cuts funding for the FIRE Act, the main program that provides equipment, training and staffing to local fire departments, by \$215 million--a 30% cut from current levels. The Department of Homeland Security already gets billions of dollars in FIRE Act applications each year, and the likelihood of these needs being met will be severely reduced with these budget cuts.

"These [FIRE ACT] reductions represent a continuing pattern in which President Bush has either not included any funding for the FIRE Act or substantially reduced funding below what Congress appropriated the prior year."⁴

Harold Schaitberger, General President of the International Association of Fire Fighters, AFL-CIO/CLC, recently discussed the effect of the President's budget as follows:

Representative (name) added: **"9/11 demonstrated just how ill-equipped the nation's dedicated firefighters are when it comes to responding to acts of terrorism and other emergencies. Years after 9/11, many firefighters still do not have the equipment they need to respond to an emergency situation. The President's proposed budget seriously compromises this effort."**

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LAW ENFORCEMENT TERRORISM PREVENTION CUTS

The President's budget eliminates the Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention program (LETP), which assists local law enforcement agencies in information sharing, target hardening, threat recognition and mapping, counter-terrorism and security planning, interoperable communications, and terrorist interdiction.

Additionally, states and local governments can use up to 25% of the LETP allocation to support overtime costs incurred when the Department of Homeland Security raises the threat level to "high orange" because of risks to critical infrastructure security. Cuts to the LETP will create yet another unfunded mandate on states and local governments.

Instead of a dedicated grant program to support the needs of law enforcement, the President's budget mandates that at least 20% of State Homeland Security Grants and Urban Area Security Initiative regional grants go for law enforcement terrorism prevention activities. This means that law enforcement will be eligible for less funding next year than this year.

1. Attached as Appendix # 3 is a copy of your state's LETP allocation in FY 2005. This funding will be eliminated under the President's budget.
2. Attached is a sample press release for you to use on the LETP cuts.
3. Hold a press conference with a local police union highlighting the effect of the LETP cuts.
4. Conduct and publish a survey of police in your district on whether they have communications equipment that is interoperable with other first responders in the event of an emergency.
5. Determine the overtime costs that communities in your district incurred during the 6 times the alert level was raised to "high orange" since March 12, 2002. Highlight the effect of the LETP cuts on the ability to compensate local governments for these costs.

Cabral, President of the International Union of Police Associations, described the impact of the President's budget as follows: "In addition to jeopardizing crucial counter terrorism programs at the local level, the elimination of the Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program will place an unfair burden on local jurisdictions who bear the burden of large overtime payments every time the federal government raises the security threat level."

Representative (name) added: **"without the Local Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention program, police will not be prepared to prevent terrorist attacks or respond to them when they occur. States and local communities will also face more overtime costs when police have to respond to a potential terrorist threat."**

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Cuts to Major Medical Facilities Preparing for Terrorist Attack

The President's budget eliminates the Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS), a \$28.2 million program that helps 124 metropolitan medical systems enhance and sustain their preparedness to respond to mass casualties from a disaster. The mass casualty events can be the result of incidents ranging from chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive attacks to epidemic outbreaks, natural disasters, and large-scale hazardous materials events.

Each MMRS grantee received \$227,592 in FY 2005. If a location is in your district, it will not receive this funding under the President's budget.

3. Hold a press conference with local nurses, doctors, or other medical professionals discussing the effect of the elimination of the MMRS program on your medical system's ability to respond to a disaster.

“Without the Metropolitan Medical Response Program,” Representative (Name) stated, “(insert MMRS recipient) will not be able to prepare for a disaster that causes mass numbers of casualties, including a terrorist attack. We know that al Qaeda seeks weapons of mass destruction that could involve a biological, chemical, or nuclear attack. Yet, the President proposes to eliminate the only federal program dedicated to helping medical systems respond to such an attack. This is unacceptable.”

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CUTS TO EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

The President's budget cuts the Emergency Management Performance Grants (EMPG) program by \$10 million — a 6 % cut. The EMPG program helps state and local emergency managers develop, maintain and improve their emergency management capabilities for all disasters, including terrorist attacks.

EMPG is the OSLGP's only program that requires a matching share (50%) from local governments (except for certain territories and commonwealths).

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CUTS TO COPS ON THE STREETS

The President brags about his small proposed increase in the Department of Homeland Security's budget, **but then he cuts programs in other departments that have a strong impact on our homeland security ---- like his proposals to nearly eliminate the Community Oriented Policing Services ("COPS") Program and the Byrne Justice grants.**

The COPS program was part of President Clinton's initiative to put 100,000 new cops on America's streets. It has permitted local governments to hire thousands of new police officers and to obtain vital equipment.

The COPS program receives \$118 million under the President's FY 2006 budget, but \$96 million of this is carried over from previous years, and only \$22 million is new budget authority. The 2005 enacted levels included \$598 million available funds, of which \$499 million was new budget authority. Therefore, the President's FY 2006 budget cuts COPS available funds by \$480 million (80.3%) below the 2005 level, and cuts COPS new budget authority by \$477 million (95.6%) below the 2005 level.

PRESS RELEASE

President's Budget Takes Cops Off the Streets Despite Terrorist Risk

Washington, D.C.— Representative (Name) released the following statement concerning the President's proposed near elimination of the Community Oriented Policing Services Program (COPS program) and the Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Grant Program (Byrne Formula Grant Program).

The COPS program began as part of President Clinton's initiative to put 100,000 new police on America's streets. In addition to helping local communities hire new police, it also provides them with funds to obtain vital equipment.

Under the President's budget, available funds for the COPS program are cut by \$480 million (80.3%) below the 2005 level. The budget also cuts the program's ability to award future grants by \$477 million (95.6%) below the 2005 level

The Byrne Formula Grant Program is a partnership among federal, state, and local governments to create safer communities. Grants may be used to provide personnel, equipment, training, technical assistance, and information systems for more widespread apprehension, prosecution, adjudication, detention, and rehabilitation of offenders who violate state and local laws. Grants also may be used to provide assistance (other than compensation) to victims of these offenders.

The following communities in Representative (name)'s district have received COPS grants in Fiscal Years 2004 and 2005: (insert grantees, purpose, and amounts).

Cabral, President of the International Union of Police Associations, described the effect of the elimination of the COPS program as follows: "The COPS program was one of the most effective federal programs I've seen in my law enforcement career. Very few, if any, local law enforcement agencies operate at proper staff levels. Cutting this program will see more police and sheriffs departments faced with dangerous staff shortages."

Representative (name) stated: **"I don't understand why the President talks so much about homeland security and then tries to eliminate the programs that put more cops on the streets and give them better tools. Our police, prosecutors, and other law enforcement officials are on the front-line of homeland security, and we must support them."**

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BORDER SECURITY GAPS

The President's budget only provides for 210 new border patrol agents nationwide, well below the 2,000 authorized for each year from 2006-2010 in the recently passed 9/11 reform bill. According to the National Border Patrol Union, more than 500 Border Patrol agents were lost to attrition last year, which means the President's budget will lead to less agents guarding our border in FY 2006.

According to DHS briefings, **the budget proposes no new border guards on the northern border.** The 9/11 reform bill called for 20% of any increase in agents to be assigned to the northern border.

Hopefully the Congress of the United States recognizes the importance of border security and will override the President's request and fully fund the increases in personnel and resources that are necessary to protect our Nation against the threat of terrorism at home."

The budget also eliminates the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP), which reimburses states and localities for costs incurred for incarcerating "undocumented criminal aliens." The program will provide \$305 million to the states in FY 2005. Even if you do not represent a district in a border state, your state still probably received SCAAP funding (see below).

The budget provides for not a single new inspector at our nation's seaports and land ports of entry, even though agents expect an increase in work loads. In FY 2003-

2005, the number of pedestrians and passengers processed at our ports of entry grew by approximately 16 million.

The budget breaks the promise in the 9/11 reform bill to add 8,000 detention beds in 2006. The budget funds only 1,920 new beds.

President's Budget Adds only 210 New Border Patrol Agents, Has No New Border Inspectors, and Under-funds (insert state)'s Detention of Illegal Aliens

Washington, D.C. — Representative (Name) released the following statement concerning the failure of the President's budget to provide for border security.

Although the recently enacted 9/11 reform bill authorized 2,000 new Border Patrol agents, the President's budget only provides for 210 new Border Patrol Agents nationwide, including not a single new agent on the northern border.

As Sam A. Cabral, President of the International Union of Police Associations, has stated: "Failure to accept the recent intelligence reforms authorization to hire up to 2,000 more Border Patrol agents not only leaves our borders highly vulnerable, but places a severe burden on the already overburdened local and state law enforcement agencies along those borders."

The President's budget also does not provide for a single new inspector at our nation's seaports and land ports of entry, even though agents expect an increase in work loads.

The National Border Patrol Council of the American Federation of Government Employees, which represents over 10,000 non-supervisory Border Patrol employees, has stated: "The Bush Administration continually fails to grasp the connection between border security and homeland security Hopefully the Congress of the United States recognizes the importance of border security and will override the President's request and fully fund the increases in personnel and resources that are necessary to protect our Nation against the threat of terrorism at home."

The President's budget also breaks the promise in the 9/11 reform bill to add 8,000 detention beds in 2006. The budget funds only 1,920 new beds. As Charles Showalter, the President of the National Homeland Security Council, has stated, "[T]he small increase in funding for detention space is not likely to eliminate the so-called 'catch and release' activities going on in Texas, Arizona, and elsewhere."

Finally, the President's budget eliminates the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP), which reimburses states and localities for costs incurred for incarcerating "undocumented criminal aliens." (Insert state) received (insert amount) in SCAAP funding in Fiscal Years 1997-2003. Additionally, the following areas received SCAAP funds in Fiscal Year 2004: (insert grantees)

Representative (name) added: **"The President's proposal to add only 210 new Border Patrol Agents and not a single new border inspector is simply ridiculous. We must fulfill the 9/11 reform bill's commitment to add 2,000 new border patrol**

agents, and we need more inspectors trained to protect our borders. To prevent possible criminals from being released and then not showing up in court, we must also fulfill the commitment to add 8,000 detention beds this year, far more than the 1,920 in the President’s budget. Finally, we must ensure (insert state) is reimbursed for its costs when it incarcerates illegal aliens.”

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AVIATION SECURITY

The President's budget has no new funding for air cargo screening, even though cargo still travels on passenger planes without being screened.

"To make matters worse, the Bush budget also fails to provide the resources and funding necessary to screen all cargo on all passenger aircraft at every airport. That isn't going to happen anytime soon with the approach this White House is taking, and, for the nation, the implications are ominous."

There are 9 airports currently participating in this program, but dozens of more airports have sent the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) letters of intent requesting funding.

The budget includes \$1.5 billion in new revenues from higher security fees for airline passengers. Under the President's budget, fees for a one-way flight would jump by \$3 to \$5.50 or to \$8 for a one-way flight that has more than one stop. The higher fees would mean that airline passengers would be paying for about 90 percent of the cost of the Federal Government's aviation security program.

James P. Hoffa, General President of the Teamsters, a union representing several types of railroad employees stated, "The Bush administration is leaving the security of the nation's railroads up to their friends in the industry. To date, the government has allocated billions of dollars for airline security while leaving rail security out in cold, yet rails transport five-times as many passengers as airlines. The cost-cutting measures

implemented by the rail lines have meant that the valuable eyes and ears of certified locomotive engineers and other rail operating employees are being silenced."
